PERMANENT RULE ADOPTION ORDER

Office of Radon Professionals

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

The attached permanent rules are promulgated to implement Colorado House Bill 21-1195 (*Concerning the regulation of radon professionals, and, in connection therewith, requiring licensure to practice as a radon measurement professional or radon mitigation professional*). Colorado House Bill 21-1195 was signed by Governor Jared Polis on June 30, 2021, requiring radon measurement and radon mitigation professionals to become licensed by July 1, 2022, and grants the Director of the Division of Professions and Occupations' regulatory authority.

Basis

The basis for these rules are to carry out the provisions of Colorado House Bill 21-1195, and the Radon Measurement and Mitigation Licensing Act at section 12-165-101, *et seq.*, C.R.S. The specific statutory authorities that authorize this rulemaking are pursuant to sections 12-20-204(1), 12-165-105(1), and 24-4-103, C.R.S.

Purpose

The purpose of adopting these new rules is to implement Colorado House Bill 21-1195. These rules are imperatively necessary to comply with the requirements of state law. Therefore, I hereby adopt these rules on a permanent basis, and incorporate by reference the statements of basis, purpose, and statutory authority, pursuant to section 24-4-103(4)(c), C.R.S.
