MSB 17-05-30-A, Revision to the Child Health Plan Plus Eligibility Rules Concerning, Section 10 CCR 2505-3

CHP+ Assistance. The proposed rule change will amend 10 CCR 2505-3 110 to incorporate changes mandated by the State Plan Amendment for citizenship eligibility. Revisions to section 110 will be made to include eligibility for children who have a pending application for Special Immigrant Juvenile status under 8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(27)(J). Other updates will include removing the 40 qualifying quarters of work since it is not required to be eligible for the Child Health Plan Plus program. The Colorado Benefits Management System (CBMS) is currently in alignment with federal requirements, so no updates are needed at this time.

With the proposed rule, the 40 qualified work quarter requirement will be removed for the eligibility of qualified non-citizens as categorized in §435.406. Additionally, children pending Special Immigrant Juvenile Status will be eligible for Child Health Plan Plus, and do not need to meet the 5-year bar.

The primary change is to edit rule language to align with current policy and practices. As such, there are no costs to the Department or any other agency, and no anticipated effect on state revenues. The benefit of the rule is to align actual policy to procedures that are currently in effect. Inaction would result in continued misalignment between rule language and policy, and language must be corrected to comply with federal regulations and the State Plan Amendment.
