

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING HEARING BEFORE THE COLORADO SOLID AND HAZARDOUS WASTE COMMISSION

SUBJECT:

For consideration of the amendments to 6 CCR 1007-3, Part 6, along with the accompanying Statement of Basis and Purpose, the following will be considered:

Amendment of 6 CCR 1007-3, Part 6 - Regulations Pertaining to Hazardous Waste - Annual Solid and Hazardous Waste Commission Fee

These modifications are made pursuant to the authority granted to the Solid and Hazardous Waste Commission in Section 25-15-302(2), C.R.S.

The purpose of the proposed amendment is to revise paragraph (a) of Section 6.04 to reflect the annual commission fees to be assessed for fiscal year 2021-2022. Please note that this does not change the amounts of the annual commission fees, but changes the rule to reflect the 2021-2022 fiscal year. The current fee amounts are adequate to cover the commission's anticipated expenses for fiscal year 2021-2022.

Any information that is incorporated by reference in these proposed rules is available for review at the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Hazardous Materials and Waste Management Division and any state publications depository library.

Pursuant to C.R.S. §24-4-103(3), a notice of proposed rulemaking was submitted to the Secretary of State on April 14, 2021. Copies of the proposed rulemaking will be mailed to all persons on the Solid and Hazardous Waste Commission's mailing list on or before the date of publication of the notice of proposed rulemaking in the Colorado Register on April 25, 2021.


