I am experiencing a feeling of inadequacy because I am not able to currently operate with both-feet inside the state physically. I also don't want to waste my time there with regards to using up all my 6 months of stay, as a Canadian wanting to conduct business in Colorado State.

The next time I enter the country-- outside of leisure-- will be on a business Visa.

There are some amazing Start-up programs available that have 9-month durations, including pilot funding programs.

after I made the realization that I've only been pursuing this for under a year and that I need to secure help so that I'm no longer a solopreneur.

The reality of pursuing a business is that both sustainable and completely new ventures need to be held to the same metrological standards , and pass the same tests to filter out fraudulent activity. Business is serious and it affects people's livelihoods, access to food, and basic resources.
