Subject: Comments - working draft election rules

I object to the Amendments to Rules 16.2.1(c) and Rule 20.5.2(f). The accuracy and privacy of the voting system in Colorado should be the paramount goal of the Colorado Secretary of State's office. Any change in the rules that makes access to anyone's vote by hacking or through use of Wi-Fi is a failure of your obligations and a dereliction of your duties, regardless of which party you belong to.

Inclusion of a Wi-Fi or other wireless capacity in a voting system cannot meet your obligations to the voters of Colorado. Frankly, with the Republican efforts to control the voting machines and the internet counting of votes, any change recommended by a Republican Secretary of State must be held to the highest scrutiny. These proposed changes do not meet that scrutiny.
