Subject: Internet and email voting

Secretary of State Williams,

We are appalled to learn that your office is pushing internet and email voting. As if there are not enough concerns about mail ballot and polling place voting, now you want to add even more possibility of fraud into the mix. We have lived in Pueblo County for 3 decades and are extremely concerned about fraudulent voting in this county given what we have seen in the elections process.
