Ladies and Gentlemen: Colorado elections belong to the people. Unfortunately, Secretary of State Griswold does not agree. In her June 17th emergency rules proclamation, Griswold unilaterally attempted to block election transparency in our state.

Her moves REEK of fear of what would be found in an election audit. What is she concerned about with the findings of an audit? If she is certain that the election was run properly, then wouldn't a forensic audit be able to do nothing more than prove that fact? If she is uncertain, then SHE ought to be calling for a forensic audit.
